Habitat for Humanity of Seminole County Receives Donation From The Rotary Club of Oviedo

(October 15, 2008) Oviedo, FL - The Rotary Club of Oviedo presented a \$10,000 donation to Habitat for Humanity of Seminole County at its October 15th meeting in support of Habitat's mission to build simple, decent and affordable homes for Seminole County's low-income people in need, and to provide such persons with support services that promote their successful home purchase and ownership.

The donated funds are a part of those raised by the Rotary Club of Oviedo's Movie Blockbuster Event held on May 22, 2008, which featured "Indiana Jones and Kingdom of the Crystal Skull", and of which Habitat for Humanity of Seminole County was the named principal charity.

Kathleen Green, Vice President of Habitat for Humanity of Seminole County, accepted the donation and presented the Rotary Club of Oviedo with a plaque in appreciation for the club's prior and current support of their organization
